- We use superlative adjectives to compare a person or thing with a number of other people or things.
- For short adjectives, we add the + − est. Be careful of the spelling: small → the smallest big → the biggest happy → the happiest
- For long adjectives, we use the most: expensive → the most expensive popular → the most popular
- These superlative adjectives are irregular:
   qood → the best bad → the worst far → the farthest/furthest
